

Cristina Schneider, D.V.M., M.Sc., Sc.D.

Dr Cristina Schneider is a Veterinary Doctor and epidemiologist. She is a graduate of the Federal Rural University of Rio de Janeiro in Brazil and began her career in public health working in the Murialdo Health Unit – Community Health Project, in a low-income village of the city of Porto Alegre, Health Department of the state of Rio Grande do Sul, Brazil, where the principles of Primary Health Care were applied. Dr Schneider completed her specialization in Epidemiology and earned her Masters degree from the National School of Public Health (*Escola Nacional de Saúde Pública / ENSP*), Oswaldo Cruz Foundation (*Fundação Oswaldo Cruz/ FIOCRUZ*), Rio de Janeiro and then went on to earn her Doctorate in Public Health Science (concentrating in Epidemiology) from the Institute of Public Health (*Instituto de Salud Pública / ISP*) in Mexico, and her post-doctorate from Johns Hopkins University in the United States. She served as a veterinarian in the Department of Health in the state of Rio Grande do Sul, and later as a National Rabies Director in the Brazilian Ministry of Health. As professional staff at the Pan American Health Organization, Regional Office of the World Health Organization (PAHO/WHO) in Washington, DC, from 2000 onwards, Dr Schneider has been working as a Epidemiologist in Health Analysis, Regional Advisor on Veterinary Public Health (zoonoses), and currently as Advisor in Animal/Human Health Interface in the Area of Health Surveillance and Diseases Prevention and Control.
